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ПЕРЕДМОВА

Методичні рекомендації та тестові завдання для розвитку мовленнєвих навичок здобувачів ступеня вищої освіти «бакалавр» першого курсу денної форми навчання за всіма напрямками.

Методичні рекомендації допоможуть студентам оволодіти лексико-граматичним матеріалом з дисципліни в обсязі програми для вищих навчальних закладів.

Методичні рекомендації освічують дев'ять основних граматичних часів: простого, тривалого и доконаного. Розуміння цих основних формул граматичних конструкцій необхідне для активного володіння англійською мовою. Це формує базу для подальшого розширення лексичного запасу і удосконалення розмовних навичок. Усі вправи сприятимуть активізації засвоєнню граматичних форм англійської мови, а також є можливість здійснити контроль і підсумки знань студентів. При складанні методичних рекомендацій були використані різні матеріали як українських так і іноземних авторів, а також матеріали інтернет ресурсів.
